Marketing Features with Programming Instructions

Multi-Use Codes (for Wash Select II POS)

What it's all about:

Site owners can increase repeat business and revenue with the multi-use code feature. The multi-use code feature, also known as “bundled wash”, sells a number of uses of a particular wash at a preset price. This feature provides a means for the C-Store/petroleum operator to offer a package of washes at the pump or C-Store register.

Similar to a fleet account, the customer gets a single code for their multi-code purchase. The price, the number of uses, the type of wash in the package, and the feature number representing this package are preset in a **template**. Once a wash number is assigned to the package, the sale of a multi-use code is similar to that of a regular code.

Marketing Tip:

- Example: A C-Store owner can sell 6 of their top washes for the price of 5. This promotion is advertised on signage near the pumps and registers. The customer has the ability to purchase this package at the pump or at the register in the C-Store (through the POS4000). Once the package is purchased, the customer receives one code that they will use 6 times to redeem their washes. When a multi-use code is redeemed, the Wash Select display will briefly show the number of uses left for the code. If the print receipt option is enabled in the template, a receipt will be printed.

Important System Requirements & Limitations:

- Typically, site owners can set up to sell 4 washes at the pumps. The multi-use package utilizes one of those “slots”.
- The minimum software version for the Wash Select II is 5.0 and the POS4000 is 8.20.
- The POS4000 must have high fleet feature and the Wash Select II must NOT have enhanced fleet feature (VIP Wash Pass cards will not work in conjunction with multi-use codes). These features are built into the EPROMs and are not programmable; so make sure to install the right firmware.
- The multi-use code is only supported at the master POS4000 if there are remote POS4000s.
- The number of codes that can be sold is limited by the free fleet account spaces. The multi-use code shares the account space with other fleet accounts in the POS4000. The fleet account capacity is 1,000 with the high fleet feature.



Programming a Template in the POS4000 for Multi-Use Codes

Perform the command to access the Multi-Use Code Setup:

```
[CMD]
[SYSTEM SETUP]
[3] (password 3)
[ENTER]
[MENU UP/DOWN] until "External POS" is displayed
[ENTER]
[MENU UP/DOWN] until "Set Multi-Use Code" is displayed
[ENTER]
```

If it shows "Menu option not available", check the EPROMs in the POS4000 and the Wash Select II to make sure they have the correct features, then check the communication between the POS4000 and the Wash Select II. Fix the problem and try again. Then follow these steps:

Setting Up Multi-Use Code Feature

For example purposes, this sets up a multi-use code titled "Bundled Wash" in the 4th slot, 5 uses of wash #3 for the sale price of \$25.

Display on POS4000	Action Taken by You
Multi-use codes Allowed?	Press 1 , then Enter .
Enter Account Name	Enter " Bundled Wash ", then press Enter .
The Feature Requested by EXT POS	Hit 4 , then Enter . This will make the Nucleus wash 4 the bundled wash
Wash # sold in the package	Press 3 then Enter . This will set wash 3 (POS4000 configuration) for the multi-use code.
Max # of uses per package	Press 5 then Enter . This will set the wash to 5 uses.
Total package price (in cents)?	Enter " 2500 " then Enter . This will set the price to \$25.
Print code status?	Press 1 then Enter . This will print a receipt at the WSII for each use.

After these steps, the template is saved and printed.

Nucleus Programming:

1. Hit the appropriate Nucleus button to get to the carwash programming window. The person performing this task needs to have a high enough security level to access the programming, or get a one shot permission from Dresser Wayne.
2. From the resulting window, go to the following submenu:
Programming->Cash Register->Non-Fuel->Car Wash
3. Select **Modify**.

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4. Add the bundled package by typing **5 Works** in the *Name* box.
5. Add price **\$25.00** to the *Pricing* box.
6. Add a *PLU* if the location has one to assign.
7. Use **Dept Security Level**.
8. Use **Dept Tax**.
9. Use **Dept Tender Restrictions**.
10. Click the **Enable** box.
11. Click **Ok**.
12. Click **Site Setup**.
13. Make the following selections:
 - Controller Type: *Fixed Code*
 - Online: *Unitec with CWT*
 - Carwash code expires: (Enter the number of days the car wash code will be good for)
 - Car Wash Prompting: *Prompt Before Fueling*
 - Car Wash Sorting: *None*
 - Click **Ok**.
14. Perform an End-of-Day (EOD) or an End-of-Shift (EOS) in order to make the changes in programming take full effect.
